Dear Parent/Carer

Key Updates

Year 11

This cohort have been phenomenal since returning to school into Year 11. They have worked hard and embraced the Year 11 strategy overseen by Mr Saberton, Associate Senior Leader and Raising Standards Leader. They are now starting their 5-1 Countdown, have had two sessions this week on effective revision strategies and approaches, have brought home their 40-Hour Revision Challenge cards, launched their own iStudy area and embraced their 3 additional mornings of additional Maths and English tutoring. Teaching and Learning

This term we have implemented a new Teaching and Learning Lesson structure. We have really pushed presentation and taking pride in work and books. The impact is clear when you walk around the lessons. We also have worked hard on lesson entry and exit routines, starter 'Do Now' tasks to build memory, and staff circulation to target and support students who need this support. This needs fine tuning and greater consistency across the school so will remain the focus next half term.



Attendance

Attendance is crucial for all learners to be able to achieve and do well. We are doing ok in that we have higher attendance than what we achieved last year, but there are still improvements to be made. We must make the curriculum so accessible and ambitious for all, that children do not want to miss a day! That is the goal, and we will get there. However, we do need to also celebrate good attendance, and so the Heads of Year and Mr Gilbert have organised celebration events whereby +1 Club students (those who have gone up to the next attendance percentage band or stayed high all half term) will have a movie reward. They deserve it! We have 325/510 students who will take part in the rewards, and these will take place during periods 4 and 5 today as follows:

- Year 7 and 8 (114 students) film in the main hall Period 4
- Year 11 (64 students) film and early lunch in the small hall Period 4
- Year 9 and 10 (147 students) film in the main hall period 5

Each term the rewards will become greater, hold a higher value and be more innovative. School is also about having fun and coming together. Please understand though that no-one is penalised by this initiative. People do get ill and need to rest, and that is factored into the +1 Club Project.
