As we near the end of the current term and look forward to Christmas, I am writing to update you on some of the academy's activities and information.

Christmas Celebrations

Next week we celebrate Christmas and students have the traditional Christmas events to look forward to.

Christmas lunch will be on Wednesday 13 December. There will be no food served by the canteen at morning break on this day and lunchtime will be staggered so that there is ample time for all students to participate who wish to. If your child wishes to have lunch, please ensure there are funds on ParentPay as it's always very popular (current cost £2.75). If not they will need to bring a packed lunch.

The last day of term is Tuesday 19 December. Students will be allowed to wear a Christmas jumper on this day. Normal academy uniform should otherwise be worn.

Our Christmas concert will be on Wednesday 13 December at 7pm. Tickets are available on ParentPay at a cost of £3 per person. We look forward to bands, singers, dance and the cheer team plus our choir's performances.

Uniform

As the temperature has dropped just a reminder that students can wear a plain black V-neck jumper beneath their blazer as an additional layer if they feel cold. Outdoor coats can be worn outside at break and lunchtime should your child wish to spend time outside at social time.

Teaching and Learning Marking and Feedback

Students have recently had assemblies about receiving feedback from teachers. We want students to recognise that feedback is essential for them to progress and improve and that feedback should not be seen as a threat. We are trying to help students to become assessment capable learners, who understand what they need to do to get better through practice. Students have recently told us in a survey that they prefer feedback that is live and specific, and that it is important that they have time to act on any feedback. Departments are currently reviewing ways of using feedback to ensure it is motivational and meaningful and that students have time to make improvements.

Students who have completed mock exams will have been given feedback from their teachers and have had dedicated improvement and reflection time to advance their progress and learn from any misconceptions. We have been very proud of our students and how they have prepared and conducted themselves under examination conditions. A massive well done to KS4. Study for the Summer exams should start now as research suggests little and often is key along with cramming towards the end of Spring. Cramming does not work without revisiting throughout courses.

Celebrating mistakes in Learning!

Sticking at learning can sometimes be hard. Learning is never intended to be easy and having a growth mindset and accepting mistakes are part of learning. Please encourage your child to show resilience when learning is hard; to stick with learning even if they make a mistake (this is expected) and to ask lots of questions in lessons - this is an essential skill that we are asking students to demonstrate for house points.
